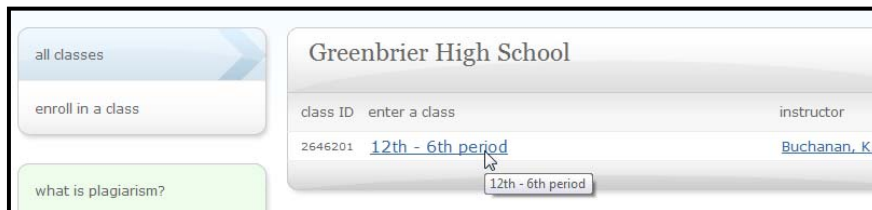


Tutorial - Submitting a document to Turnitin.com

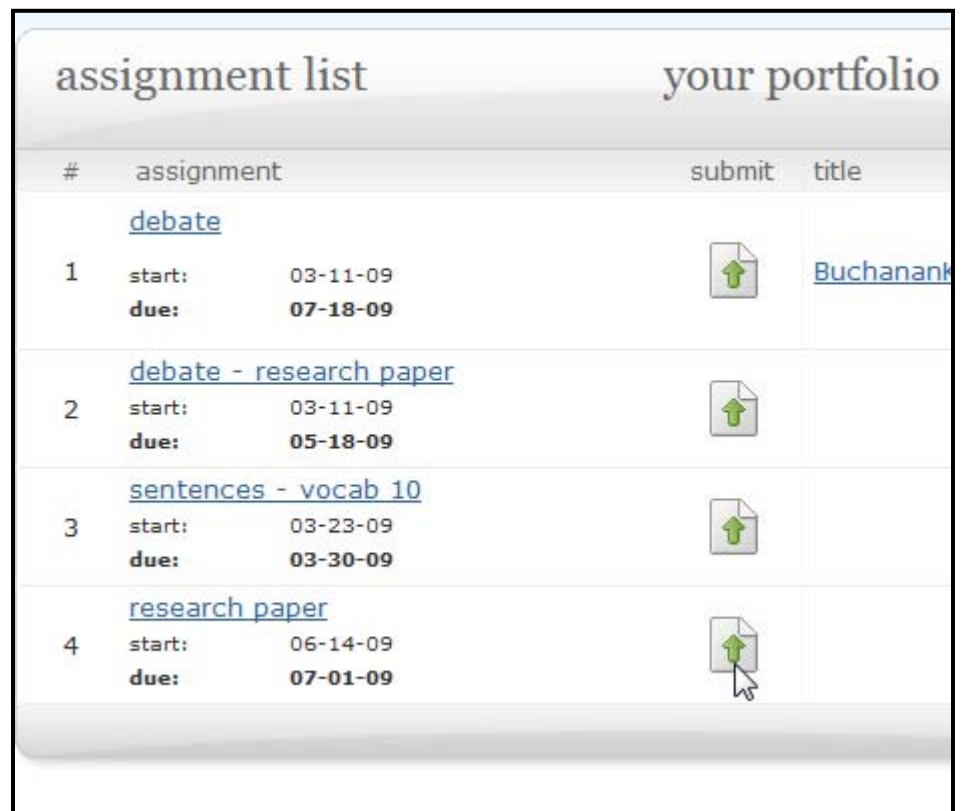
Step 1: Open your web browser and type in the following address: www.turnitin.com

Step 2: When the Turnitin website loads, log on using your email address and password.




Step 3: Click on the class for which you need to submit your document.

Step 4: Find the correct assignment title, and then click on the appropriate icon under the "submit" column.




Step 5: Add a “submission title” and browse for the file you want to upload. Then click “submit.”



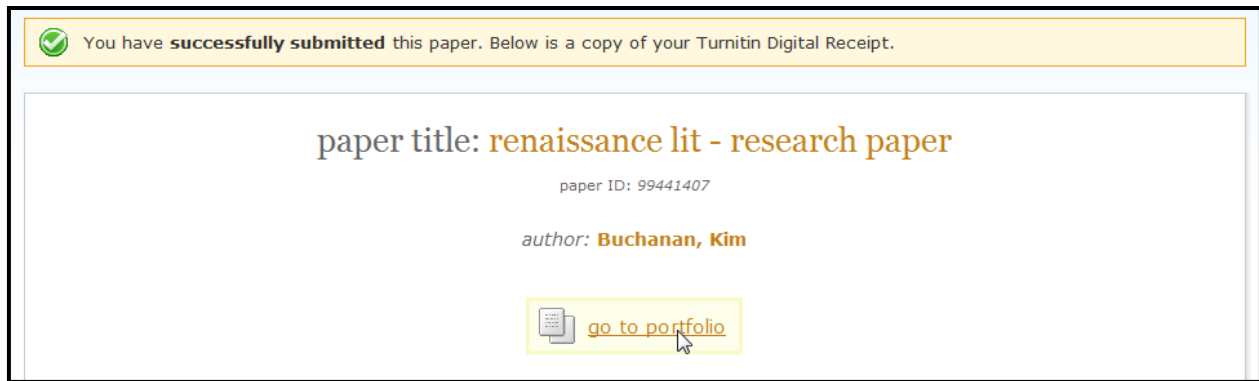

Step 6: You should then see an unformatted version of your entire paper pop up on the screen. Turnitin will ask you, “Is this the paper you want to submit?” Make sure it is the correct document before clicking “yes, submit.”

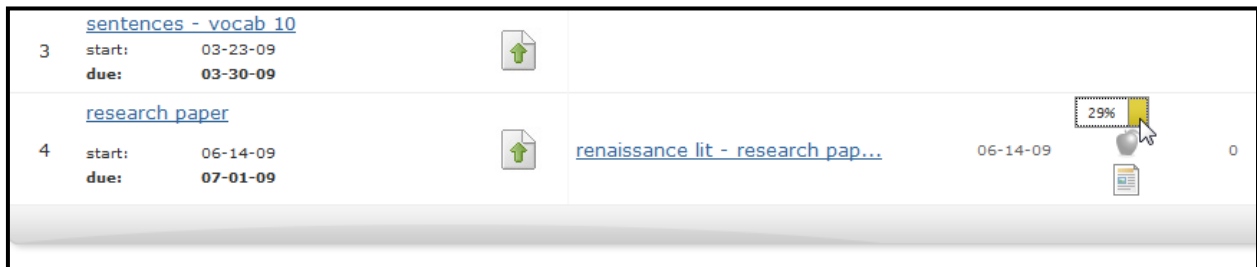

Step 7: Once you see the screen below, click on “go to portfolio” to return to your class portfolio page.



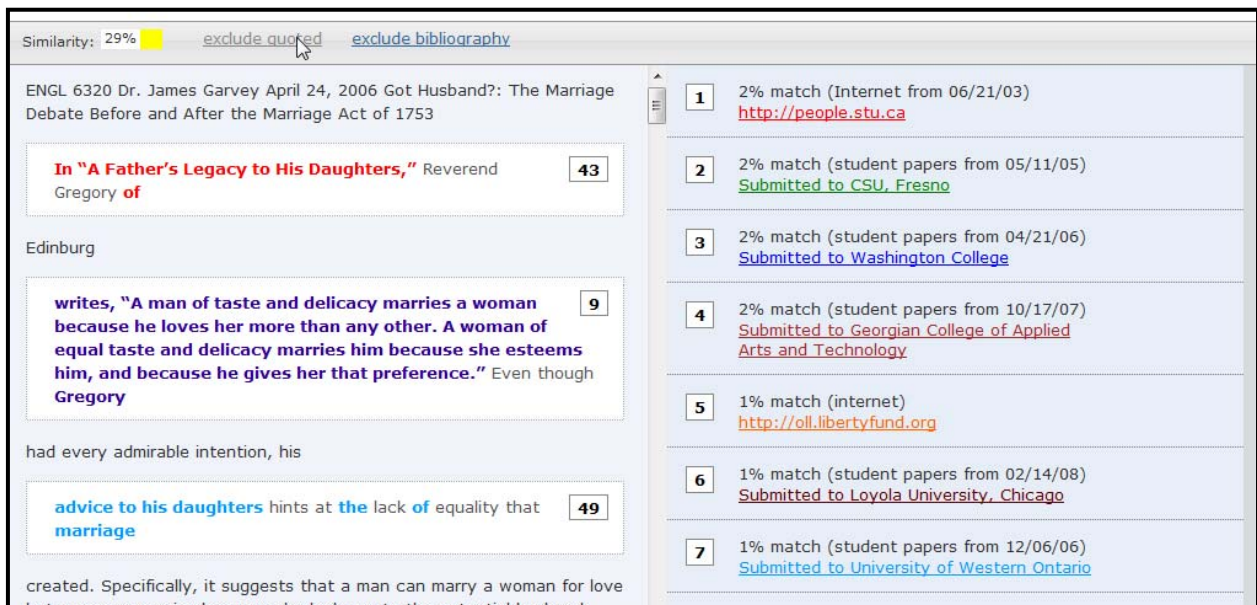
Step 8: To see your originality report, click on the colored box next to the percentage. If the box is gray, that means that Turnitin is still processing your paper. Be patient.



After a few minutes, if the color has not changed, refresh the page.



Step 9: When the originality report appears, click “exclude quoted” and “exclude bibliography.”

If you have to return to the original document in Word and fix your phrasing, you will be able to resubmit your paper to this same assignment. You will only be able to do so, however, until the due date of the assignment.

Step 11: Once you have achieved the lowest percentage possible, print the originality report.

Many students ask me, "What is a good percentage?"

My answer: There is no "good percentage." After all, your goal is always 0%.

However, it is your responsibility to review your originality report and address each item the software has marked as plagiarism.

Turnitin is a resource used to help you identify unintentional plagiarism. You will NOT be penalized for the results on the originality report; HOWEVER, you will earn a "0" on the assignment if (1) it is not submitted to Turnitin at all and/or (2) you do not make the necessary changes and resubmit the revised paper/assignment to Turnitin. This resource allows you to take full ownership of your work, so use it constructively.

Also remember that you need to do this prior to submitting your final document. Often there is a 24-hour waiting period for resubmissions. That cannot be used as an excuse for a late Turnitin originality report.

YOU MUST TURN IN AN ORIGINALITY REPORT FOR EVERY ASSIGNMENT SUBMITTED TO TURNITIN.COM ON THE DAY AFTER THE ASSIGNMENT IS DUE.

A late Turnitin originality report will result in a letter grade reduction per day on your final assignment grade.

To save paper and ink, please print all your originality reports using "fast draft" quality and two to a page (see tutorial).
